RULES AND REGULATIONS.

1. The show will open at 9.00 a.m.(No entry before this time)
2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitors responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
3. Judging will commence at 9.30 a.m.
4. The show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed by which time dogs must be removed. Exhibits may be removed from the show after their judging has been completed. Exhibits may not be removed any earlier unless by written order of the Veterinary Surgeon, Veterinary Practitioner or of the Show Management and then only in very exceptional and unforeseen circumstances which must be reported to the Kennel Club.
5. The use of cooking stoves in the precincts of the show is forbidden except as authorised by the Show Management.
6. Entry Fees: Members £5.00 First Entry Per Dog, subsequent classes £1.50.
Non-Members:£6.50 First Entry Per Dog, subsequent classes £2.00.
7. No prize money will be paid at this show. Specials available as listed to fully paid up Members at the time of entry.
8. The Committee reserves the right to refuse entries.
9. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the show are not eligible for exhibition.
10. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the show is strictly forbidden.
11. **BEST PUPPY IN SHOW.** Where a Best Puppy In Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy In Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy entered at the same show. A Puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the show. Selection of Best Puppy In Show must follow the selection of Best In Show. Best Puppy In Show must be selected from Puppies which have been judged and are unbeaten by any other puppy.
WITHDRAWAL FROM COMPETITION. Puppies which become eligible for Best Puppy In Show may be withdrawn from all other competitions, other than breed classes and Best Puppy in Breed, prior to the competition for Best Puppy In Show in order to remain unbeaten. A Dog beaten in competition for Best Puppy In Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The Dog declared Best Puppy In Show, however must not compete in any subsequent competition. Proviso: For the purpose of this regulation dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace, Team or a special award confined to one breed will not be considered to be a beaten dog.
12. **BEST IN SHOW.** The dog declared Best In Show is a dog which has competed and is unbeaten by any other dog exhibited at the same show. Best In Show must be selected from exhibits declared Best Of Sex provided they are unbeaten winning dogs. Reserve Best In Show must be selected from the Best Opposite Sex and the Reserve Best Of Sex to the exhibit declared Best In Show.
WITHDRAWAL FROM COMPETITION. Dogs which become eligible for Best In Show may be withdrawn from all other competition prior to the competition for Best In Show as appropriate in order to remain unbeaten. A Dog beaten in competition for Best In Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The Dog declared Best In Show, must not compete in any other competition. Proviso: For the purpose of this regulation dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace, Team or a special award confined to one breed will not be considered to be a beaten dog.
13. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best In Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging unless they have unavoidably been delayed by the previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with special permission of the Show Management.
14. No modifications will be made to this schedule except by special permission of the General Committee of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by an advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.
15. All Exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (annex B).Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.

16. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club authority to compete number before entry to the show can be made. All overseas entries without an authority to compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
17. The Committee will not be responsible for the loss or damage to the dogs or Property whether arising from accident or any cause whatsoever, nor from any acts of omission by themselves, their officers, servants or others and it is on this understanding only that entries are accepted.
18. Rules and Regulations or Definitions and Instructions of the nature of Rules and Regulations printed for convenience in other parts of this schedule shall be deemed to be regulations of the Committee and shall have the same effect as if they formed part of these regulations.
19. Should any question arise not provided for in these regulations and show regulations the decision of the Committee shall be final subject only to appeal to the Kennel Club.
20. Should a judge be prevented from fulfilling his/her engagement, the committee reserve the right to appoint a substitute. Exhibitors are at liberty to withdraw from competition but no entrance fees can be returned.
21. Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form.

REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION F (Annex B) 1st JANUARY 1988

1. These Regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under these Show Regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A42.
 - A) A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these Regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained there at.
 - B) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these Regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule A42.
2. A) No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the show.
 - b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or on any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition.
3. No act or operation which alters the natural formation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except
 - a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee,
 - b) The removal of dewclaws of any breed,
 - c) The shortening of tails of customarily docked Breeds but only up to an acceptable age limit which shall be prescribed from time to time.
 - d) Operations to prevent breeding provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown. Nor must anything be done calculated to in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive.
4. The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog at any show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
5. An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog, competing in the same breed or class. An objection may however, be lodged by an official of the show or by anyone deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the complaint or the official (as appropriate) to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
6. Any objection by an individual related to the infringement of these regulations must be made in writing to the show secretary at his/her office before the close of the show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.

DOGS IN CARS ON HOT DAYS

Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.

- _ When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
 - _ If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
 - _ The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
 - _ Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
 - _ When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
 - _ Keep the dog in the shade – take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
 - _ Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.
- Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.

Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. Right to Refuse Entries. Exhibitors/Competitors are reminded that show societies have the right under Kennel Club Regulation to refuse any entry.

DEFINITION OF CLASSES

In the following definitions a Challenge Certificate includes any show awards that counts towards the title of Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club.

Wins at Championship shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.

In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in members classes or competing for members specials, each partner at the time of entry must be a member of this society.

In estimating the number of awards won when entering any class all wins up to and including the seventh day before the closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. 15.12.12 Wins in variety classes do not count for entry in breed classes but when entering for variety classes wins in both breed and variety classes must be counted. A First prize does not include a special prize of whatever value.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible the exhibitor may choose one of the following options.

- 1) Withdrawal, the dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of regulations 9(j) and 20.
- 2) Transfer
 - a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its breed, colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour,sex, weight or height and , in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
 - b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy Class or Puppy Class or Junior Class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age,or eighteen calendar months of age or twenty-four calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy Class, Junior Class or Yearling Class respectively for the correct breed,colour,sex,weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy Class, Junior Class or Yearling Class to the Open Class for the correct breed,colour,sex,weight or height.
 - c) For any reasons other than the above the show secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Open Class for the correct breed,colour,sex,weight or height.

d)If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered the dog may not be transferred to any other classes.

With these provisos the following are definitions of certain classes:-

MINOR PUPPY For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of the show.

PUPPY For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the show.

JUNIOR For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the show.

MAIDEN For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or a First prize at Open or Championship shows (minor puppy, special minor puppy, puppy, and special puppy classes excepted whether restricted or not)

NOVICE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate three or more First prizes at Open or Championship shows (minor puppy, special minor puppy, puppy, and special puppy classes excepted whether restricted or not)

YEARLING For dogs of twelve and not exceeding twenty four calendar months of age on the first day of the show.

GRADUATE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or four or more First prizes at Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open Classes whether restricted or not.

POST GRADUATE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or five or more First prizes at Championship Shows in, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Limit, Limit and Open Classes whether restricted or not.

LIMIT For dogs which have not become show Champions under Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club or won seven or more First prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit and Open classes confined to the breed whether restricted or not and where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

OPEN For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at this show.

VETERAN For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the first day of the show.

Directions to Venue.

From M1. Junction 36.

Take the A61 signed to Sheffield for 4 1/2 miles (through woodland). Arriving at the Norfolk Arms, Grenoside, turn right up to the crossroads in Grenoside Village. Turn left at crossroads, the Centre is 200m on the left below the Church. Please use the Big Car Park.

From M1. Junction 35. (Not Meadow Hall)

Take the A629 signed to Penistone, down 1/2 mile then take the 1st road on the left, 1 mile to Ecclesfield, straight on through traffic lights, then 1st left up Church Street, past the Church on the right and straight on up Wheel Lane, 1 mile to A61, straight on up through the traffic lights, 300 yards (Hospital on left) to the crossroads. Turn right up Main Street, the Centre is on the right before the Church. Please use the Big Car Park.

From Manchester on A628.

Down past Dog and Partridge on your right, and at the Flouch roundabout turn right onto A616 for 5 miles and up to the junction with A629, then 1 mile on the A629, joining the A61 and 2 miles through woodland to Grenoside then as above from Junction 36.

From Hull and Doncaster.

The M18, M1, but you may find it better on the A635 than the new A6195 Dearne Valley Way to join the A61 at Birdwell roundabout. Then as above.
